RELOCAL investigates the role of **localities** and how places and communities can strengthen their involvement in the design, delivery and deployment of **European cohesion policies** in order to achieve higher levels of **spatial justice and cohesion**.

RELOCAL applies a **bottom-up approach** from the local to the European level. It is based on the analysis of 33 contextually sensitive **case studies** and continuous multilevel stakeholder engagement.
